A representative from the charity The Passage spoke to the KS2 children this week to explain their role in supporting homeless people in the UK. He thanked the school for their donations from the KS2 Advent Concert and the KS1 Nativity plays. He explained the work of the charity and how this money would help them.



Year 5 have been very busy this week. They visited the Bromley Synagogue.

The children took part in the Jewish Living Experience held at the synagogue. They thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Jewish faith especially information on the Passover, Hanukah and the importance of the Torah.







Year 5 took part in a Glider Challenge Workshop on Friday which was organised by The Smallpeice Trust.

Their aim is to give young people everything they need to fuel their passion for engineering and are supported by the Royal Air Force Charitable Trust. In part one of the workshop, the children followed instructions to build three prototype gliders from card, they were then launched by the children. They measured the distance and the time to calculate the speed of their glider. In part two, the children had to design a sustainable aircraft of the future.
