Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents,

I hope everyone had a lovely half term holiday.

We are thinking this half term about the Catholic Virtue of co-operation. The children will be nominating each other if they see examples of co-operation at school.

We received a lovely letter this week from The Bromley Foodbank thanking us for our donations before half term. Thank you to everyone who contributed.

Year 6 have been taking part in Bike Ability this week and have been learning about how to maintain their bike and control their bike when setting off, cruising, slowing down, braking and stopping. They have practised pedalling with one hand and have been able to pass stationary vehicles parked on a road and can understand the road signals, signs and road markings.



We held a Fire Practice one lunchtime this week and all children and staff were quickly accounted for at our muster point on the KS2 Playground.

We attended All Saints Day Mass this week. Thank you to Year 5 for leading this. It was a wonderful way to start our Prayer Day.

To celebrate All Saints Day, the pupils had the opportunity to explore and learn about saints from around the world. These included; St Teresa of Calcutta, St Martin de Porres, St Kateri Tekakwitha and St Josephine Bakhita. The children discussed why saints are inspirational and explored ways in which we can learn from them.

The open letter "Fratelli Tutti" by Pope Francis was also a key feature of the day. The classes reflected on the content of the letter which encourages us to extend a helping hand to our brothers and sisters in need. Pope Francis reminds us that if we wish to build a better world, we must dream together. Inspired by these words, pupils were encouraged to imagine their ideal world and consider how they can contribute towards this. They expressed how they can give a helping hand for a kinder world, where everyone is treated with respect and understanding.

Word on Wednesday

The Wednesday Word is HUMBLE. This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that God will reward those who are humble. We explained to the children that humble means not boasting and being honest about our weaknesses. Humble people are not afraid to say sorry when they are wrong. Humble people notice and praise other people's strengths and successes and remember to regularly give thanks to God for their own gifts. A humble person

knows that all good comes from God and that any talents we have are gifts from God. There are many blessings in life and we should not take them for granted.

Safeguarding

The following is advice from Brake, the road safety charity:

Top tips for cycling safely with children

- Seek routes, where you can, that are entirely off road, using segregated cycleways away from traffic. For anyone, of any age, cycling on roads is risky. Rural roads with lots of bends and high speeds are particularly risky, and so are urban streets with high volumes of traffic, trucks and buses.
- Brake doesn't recommend that children under the age of 10 cycle on roads, ever.
- Campaign for segregated cycleways in your community, particularly between your home and your children's school and other community facilities such as shops. Follow the links below to find out more.
- Get cycle trained.
- The whole family should wear cycle helmets; set a good example for your children by wearing a helmet too.
- If you and your children use roads to cycle, make sure you all have lights and wear bright clothing such as high-visibility vests. This particularly helps drivers with poorer vision to see you on dull days as well as at night.
- Make sure your child's helmet is new and undamaged. Don't use a second-hand helmet. Fit your child's helmet with care, making sure the strap is snug under their chin.
