Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents,

We started the week by asking children what they would do if they could not find anyone to play with at breaktimes. They were able to explain how they use the Friendship Stop in the playgrounds if they are looking for friends to play with.

We also reminded the children that we have 'Feelings Boxes' in all classrooms if they would like to add notes in the box for an adult to read about how they are feeling.

We were delighted to welcome some of our Governors to school on Tuesday. They visited classrooms, observed KS1 Collective Worship, stood at the school gate at the end of the day and visited After School Club.

A highlight of our week was our whole school Harvest Mass. Year 4 led the Mass and we were very proud of them. It was the first time Reception Class had attended a whole school Mass and they were a joy to be with. Thank you to Mrs Anderson for playing the piano for us. All children were asked to bring in a donation for the Bromley Foodbank. We were assigned as a 'Shampoo and Long-Life Fruit Juice School' and everyone was very generous. Thank you for supporting this. We would like to thank Mary O' Mahony and Linda Samuels from the Justice, Peace and the Integrity of Creation Group at St James' Church for kindly transporting the goods to the Foodbank. Thank you also to the Mini Vinnies who helped to load the donations into the car.





Thank you to the children who have been attending Rosary Club this week. They have shown real dedication each morning by arriving at school early. Thank you also to Mrs Wilson for arranging this.

I held a Student Council Meeting this week. It was lovely to meet our new class representatives and hear their suggestions. These children are voted for by their peers as children who can represent them. There is one representative from each class and two in Year 6. We meet once every half term. Thank you to the KS2 parents who attended the Reading Comprehension talk on Wednesday night that Mrs Connolly and Mrs Wilson gave. I hope that you found it informative. Please see the attached PowerPoint slides from the evening.

This week, Father David came to meet Reception Class. He told us all about the things that he does. We shared the work we have done about God's world with him and he taught us one of the responses to use in Mass. We asked him lots of questions. We found out that his favourite colour is blue and he likes to eat pasta and pizza!



Year 5 planned and led the KS2 Collective Worship this week. The theme was forgiveness.



This week, Year 3 created Stonehenge using biscuits. They used different shaped biscuits to highlight the different type of stones—the Bluestones, Sarsens stones and Lintel stones - that arrived at Stonehenge throughout the Bronze Age



Year 3 also has two special visitors this week to celebrate Black History Month. They explored the story of a greedy spider who stole all the fruit at a picnic. Year 3 discovered the moral of this story was that we are all equal and should share what we have. They even got to taste Plantain Chips! Thank you to our visitors.



I met a representative from Bromley Y this week to see how we can continue to use their services. Bromley Y is a Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing Service in Bromley that provides support to schools, parents and children.

In November you and your child will be invited to a 'Goal Sharing Appointment' with the class teacher for a 10-minute meeting to discuss your child's targets for the year. Obviously, if you have child care issues because of siblings only one parent needs to attend. The After-School Club will also be open as usual until 6pm if you already use this and book your children in. The Goal Sharing appointments will be available to book online from 7:30pm on Thursday 2nd November. Further details will follow about this.

Teachers have asked me to thank all the families who are celebrating their children's birthdays by donating a book to the class library. These books are stamped with the child's name and added to the class libraries. If parents and children would like to do this you are asked to look at the class Amazon Wish List on the PTA section of the website.

This process ensures that all children have equal and fair access to a school place without reference to ability, aptitude, or additional educational need (including SEND).

A Supplementary Information Form should be completed and returned to the school with the appropriate documentation at the same time as an application is made to Bromley.


