Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents,

We were delighted this week to hear from HSBC that we had been awarded the 2023 HSBC UK Smart Money Award. HSBC have been visiting the school termly for the last year and the teachers believe that the children have really benefited from these visits. Thank you to Mrs Richards who continues to organise this.

This week staff attended allergy training delivered by Bromley Health Care. Please remember to keep the school updated on any allergies that the children have and ensure that any Epi Pens or Jext pens are in date. Can you also ensure that your child has asthma that we have a spacer in school for them to use with their inhaler.

This week I was invited to assist Greenwich University in interviewing prospective PGCE students for the University. It was a privilege to be involved in helping to select the next generation of student teachers and there was a wealth of energised graduates ready to embark on their future careers. I look forward to continuing to be involved in this work with the University.

The PTA held their first meeting of 2023 on Wednesday and I would like to take this opportunity to thank those that attended the meeting for their continued service to the school. Without the support that the PTA provides we would not be able to provide the resources that we do and I know that the staff appreciate all their hard work.

Father David visited us on Thursday to celebrate Year 4's Class Mass on the theme of Christian Unity. He reminded the children that as Catholics we are all Christians. The children had prepared the Mass so well. Thank you, Year 4.

This week Year 3 took part in an Art Workshop where they participated in a zoom call with The National Gallery. Mr Dickinson virtually showed them around the gallery and pointed out important paintings. They then concentrated on the painting 'The Coronation of the Virgin' by Jacopo di Cione. They discussed how this beautiful painting was a massive task for that period and how expensive it was to be commissioned, as it used real gold. They then tried recreating this artwork but without the real gold! Thank you to Miss Spencer-Boyce for arranging this.





The KS2 Choir travelled to the O2 on Thursday night to perform with The Young Voices. I hope the children enjoyed this amazing opportunity. They travelled up to the O2 during the day and spent the day rehearsing before performing with approximately 8500 children and Heather Small of M People. The children had a fantastic night and behaved wonderfully. Thank you to all parents who came to watch us and those that accompanied us too. A huge thank you to Miss Atkinson for all her hard work in organising this and to Miss McCarthy for coming too. Thank you to the KS2 Choir for taking part so enthusiastically. Well done! What an experience for the children!







Year 5 took part in a Space Challenge Workshop on Friday which was organised by The Small Piece Trust. They aim to give young people everything they need to fuel their passion for engineering and are supported by the Royal Air Force Charitable Trust. In part one of the workshop, the children followed instructions to build a rocket from card and launched it using a straw. They had to evaluate the effect of fins and investigate how the launch angle and the payload can affect the range of the rocket. In part two, the children had to design a sustainable aircraft of the future. One of the designs will be entered into the national competition. Thank you to Mrs Wilson for organising this.







As you know, we are committed to making sure that each of our children gets the best possible start to life and one way that we can do this is through ensuring good school attendance. Evidence shows that children who attend school regularly are more successful and it is therefore vital that children attend school, on time, every day in order to gain the greatest benefit from their education.

10 whole days of school have been missed if a child's attendance is 95%.

20 whole days of school have been missed if a pupil's attendance is 90%.

Attendance below 90% is seen as persistent absenteeism by the DfE and we are asked to report any to the local authority. As a school we track attendance that falls below 95%. Please remember that there are two sessions each school day, a morning and an afternoon, and that if a child is absent for the day they have missed two sessions. If children wake up feeling unwell but feel better by the afternoon please do bring them in for the afternoon session that starts at 1:15. For every day of school missed by a child it will reduce their attendance by 0.5%. Please also remember that holidays in term time will not be authorised. Children only attend school for 190 days out of 365 which leaves 175 days for holidays.

This week we sadly said good bye to Mrs Howie and the children presented her with themed cards in a whole school assembly. We wish her lots of luck as she starts her new full-time job. We are very pleased to announce that Mrs Patel, who many of you know from St James' preschool, will be working in the school office alongside Mrs Lams after half term.



Mrs Howie has written: I want to say a big THANK YOU for all the messages and gifts this week. You have all been so kind. St James' really is a very special school and it has been a privilege to work here. All the children will forever have a place in my heart. I will be back to visit very soon! Mrs Howie x

Some parents have asked me about the upcoming strikes involving teachers that are planned for 1st February, 2nd March, 15th March and 16th March. At the moment I do not know fully how this will impact St James' but in the event of a strike, I will take all reasonable steps to keep the school open. PTA NEWS

Dear Parents,

We held our Spring PTA meeting on Wednesday and the minutes and treasurer's report will be circulated shortly.

The highlights of the meeting are we were able to share that through your kind donations and effort, the PTA were able to raise over £10,000 from events last term.

In addition over £3,000 was raised through Donations and Matched funding. For those of you who are not aware here is an explanation of what Match Funding is, and how a little bit of your time could raise double the funds for the PTA.

Match Funding (or Match Giving)

If you work for an organisation that has a match funding policy, any money you raise could be matched by your employer. Companies may match the fundraising total for an event, or for the stall that their employee is working on. Usually, the employee will need to supply them with a letter from the PTA detailing the date and nature of the event, together with the total raised. We understand that the high street banks, building societies, supermarkets and large corporations are likely to do match funding, but these schemes are not exclusive to the major corporate giants. If you work for an independent company, they may be interested in charitable giving through match funding too. We would be grateful if you could see if your employer has a match funding scheme, or if they are willing to match fund any of our events. If you can't help out this time, but you know the company you work for has a match funding policy, please let us know.

This could be a really large source of income for the PTA and help us raise money through fundraising and volunteering, which can really help out when putting volunteers on certain stalls at PTA events.

If you are able to help us this way, please let the PTA know and we can discuss your company's requirements.
