Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents,

I hope you all had a good Easter.

You will shortly receive letters from the class teachers, if you have not already received them, summarising the summer term and explaining what each class will be doing. I hope that you find the letters useful.

We are promoting Catholic Virtues and this half term our focus is on Determination. We will be talking to the children about the ability to continue trying to do something, although it is very difficult. Children will nominate people that they see showing determination and we will celebrate these nominations in assembly and display the nominations in the hall.

This half term, Class teachers will be nominating children who "Share their love of God every day in all that they learn, do and say". This is our school vision in our School Mission statement. These children will then attend the Head teacher Tea Party on Fridays.

Due to the dry weather we can now use the field once more and the children are taking part in The Daily Mile. This is when the children jog for 10 minutes with their friends in the safety of their school environment. Everyone has fun taking part and it is not competitive. They build relationships, confidence and resilience. The children work on their fitness and focus on having a healthy lifestyle in the fresh air. They support one another and improve their social and leadership skills. This daily physical activity can help children concentrate back in the classroom. It is a profoundly simple but effective concept. It can improve not only the children's fitness, but also their concentration levels, mood, behaviour and general wellbeing.

The Daily Mile is a social activity, wherein the children jog at their own pace in the fresh air with friends.

This week we have welcomed Miss Tesfai to our school. She is a student teacher who will be working with Year 1 this term alongside Miss McCarthy.

We also welcomed Mr Hurley to St James' this week. He is a reading volunteer from the Schoolreaders Organisation and he will be working with Year 4 and Year 5 this term.

Please look out for the KS2 Reading Passports that are being sent out this week. They are due back on Friday 14th July and will celebrate these in an assembly.

I hope that the Year 6 parents who came into school this week to hear about the SATs in Year 6 found the information helpful. Thank you to Mrs Connolly for organising this.

It has been lovely to see the children returning to school in their summer uniforms. Please see the attached uniform policy. We ask that all children are in their summer uniforms by Tuesday 2nd May.

Letters went out this week offering places to our new Reception children in September. We are very much looking forward to these children joining our school community and for some of them to be joining their brothers and sisters at St James'.

Year 4 had a workshop with Bromley Y on Wednesday. The children discussed how all emotions are valid and that we all can feel in different ways. They discussed Zones of Regulation and where they were and how they were feeling. This will be followed up with another workshop that thinks about how we can deal with different emotions within our friendships.

The highlight of this week was of course International Day. Thank you to everyone who supported this. The children looked fabulous in their outfits and they were able to try various food from around the world. Thank you to Mrs Martin for organising such a successful event.















Year 5 carried out an in depth study of Brazil in South America. Some interesting facts found were: Brazil has four different times zones. One of the most common animals in Brazil is the Capybara. It can be 4ft long! There are 123 million Catholics in Brazil. Brazil has won the World Cup five times! The children worked together to create a fact sheet with all their interesting information.

On Saturday it will be Stephen Lawrence Day. Stephen's story is both challenging and inspirational. He was a normal young person who made the most of everyday opportunities. Although his life was short, Stephen provides a positive role model of a life well lived. He was born and grew up in south-east London and had ambitions to use his talents in maths, art and design to become an architect. He wanted to have a positive impact on his community. As we know, his dream of becoming an architect was never realised because on 22nd April 1993, at the age of just 18, Stephen was tragically murdered. Stephen Lawrence Day is about the part we all play in creating a society in which everyone can flourish. It is an opportunity for children to have their voices heard, make the changes they would like to see and create a society that treats everyone with fairness and respect. It hopefully inspires children to live their best life. Year 2 made poppies in memory of Stephen.



On Saturday it is also World Earth Day. We all have a vital role to play and must come together to look after and care for our shared world and tackle the climate crisis.

This week, KS2 were visited by Helayna Jenkins who is the Principal Loneliness Champion for the London Borough of Bromley. She led an assembly on 'Tackling Loneliness'. She discussed what loneliness was, who can experience loneliness and when it can occur. The children learnt about what resources were available to help people who felt lonely and the importance of talking about it if people feel lonely.



Finally, I am very sad to say that Mrs Stewart will be retiring at the end of this term. Mrs Stewart has worked at St James' for twenty-two years and is obviously an important part of our school family. She has worked with so many children and I know that she has had such a huge impact on their learning. She always puts the children first and goes out of her way to make sure that the children love their learning. We will all miss her very much indeed. I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank Mrs Stewart for her hard work and dedication and for all that she has contributed to the school. I hope she enjoys her last term with us.

If your child belongs to one of the uniformed organisations (Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Rainbows, Brownies and Guides etc.) then they may wear their scouting or guiding uniform to school on Monday 24th April in celebration of St. George's Day on Sunday 23rd April. Robert Baden-Powell (the founder of the Scouting Movement) chose St. George as the Patron Saint of Scouting as the story of St. George shows him overcoming adversity.


