Maths	In Maths we are focusing on:				
IVIALIIS	Multiplication exploring the formal written method of multiplication				
	 Using the formal written method of division 				
	Using division and multiplication to find the area of shapes				
	Finding equivalent fractions				
	Adding, subtracting and representing improper fractions				
	Recognising the relationships between tenths, hundredths and decimals				
RE	In RE this term, our main topics are: Jesus, the teacher and Jesus, the saviour.				
	In these topics we will be focusing on the teachings of Jesus and how these can be applied to our lives today, with a particular focus on the parables that				
	Jesus told. Closer to Easter, we will then be looking at the salvific actions of Jesus and the key events leading up to this. We will also continue studying				
	Hinduism, thinking about how Hindus worship in temples and at home.				

Science In the first half of the term we will be learning about different classifications and groupings of animals and their habitats. In the second half of the term we will be focusing on different states of matter. We will be learning about what the states of matter are and how they change, using evaporation, condensation and the water cycle.		Art There is no Art topic this term – it will be done in a variety of drawing skills activities and cross curricular sessions.		Geography This term we will be learning all about Asia with a focus on India. We will be learning about the human and physical features of the country, climate and finding the urban and rural areas. We will also be using the four compass points and using grid references to find places on a map.		
Computing We will be focusing on programming using Scratch. Continuing from last year's work we will be using more advanced features such as loops, variables and interaction between sprites.		DT We will be learning how to sew a blanket stitch this term to make our own purses. We will design these for another person thinking about their likes and dislikes and trying to fulfil their brief.		History There will be no History this term as we are studying geography.		
Music This term in music we will be looking at the genre Rock n Roll. We will be looking at how it influences the music we listen to today and also how it was written. In investigating the history of Rock n Roll, we will be composing and singing various rock n roll songs.		PE We will be focussing on gymnastics. We will be focusing on a wide range of balances, rolls, inverted movements and creating a sequence in partners.		RHE RHE introduces feelings and emotions as complex and changeable things that we sometimes can't quite understand or explain, especially when hormones are involved. Children will learn to examine their feelings, to try to understand them and what causes them. They will be given some techniques to scrutinise their feelings and determine whether they are a good or bad guide for taking action. Children will also spend time reflecting on their emotional well-being, and what they can do to help themselves stay emotionally healthy
